Committee Reports

Training, Education, and Equipment Committee [TEEC]

International Scientific Meeting (ISM)

The ISM will focus on 'Who is the Child of 2024?' Through a framework of global, community, family and child perspectives, important issues will be highlighted which impact on every child in 2024. An exciting group of international speakers have been invited to present on these four themes.

The opening address ' Who is the Child of 2024 going to be?'

will be made by Prof Steve Turner, RCPCH President. Prof Turner took up the role of President of the RCPCH in March 2024. He is a consultant paediatrician in general and respiratory paediatrics at Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital. He is active in developing integrated models of scheduled and unscheduled care for children and young people.

Prof. Louise Stroud: 'The child of the 1954 Griffiths Scales seventy years on.'

Prof Stroud is a Registered and Chartered Clinical Psychologist and Full Professor employed in the Department of Psychology at the Nelson Mandela University in Port Elizabeth, South Africa. She is also the lead Researcher for ARICD. Her specific interests include the development of children and its assessment, the psychology of people and their lives, neuropsychology and ecopsychology.

Dr Elaine Clark: '2024 at the interface of interpreting the genetic code for a future of personalised care'
Dr. Clark, Consultant Neurodevelopmental Paediatrician, is the Clinical Lead in the Neurodevelopmental Assessment Clinic at Great Ormond Street Hospital since 2014. The underlying causes for neurodevelopmental differences remains unclear and in her desire to learn more about possible contributing factors Dr Clark also works as a Clinical Fellow with the North Thames Genomics Laboratory Hub to help understand how genetic variation may impact on development, learning and behaviour.

Dr Nick Kowalenko: 'The Impact on Child Development of Parental Mental Illness'.

Dr. Kowalenko, Child Psychiatrist, Sydney, Australia, is Vice President & Oceania Coordinator of the International Association for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Allied Professions & he leads global mental health workforce initiatives for the Royal Australia & New Zealand College of Psychiatrists. He provides advice to state & national governments, NGOs & other organisations about child mental health & development.

Jordan Hill: 'What does child empowerment mean today?'

Jordan Hill, is an Analyst, Directorate for Education and Skills, OECD, Paris. Jordan's work is split between two projects within the Centre for Educational Research and Innovation: The Strengthening the Impact of Education Research project, which seeks to understand the drivers and barriers of evidence—informed education policy and practice; and the 21st Century Children project, which looks at the nature of modern childhood and what it means for education.

Prof Robin Banerjee: 'Relationships, wellbeing, and mental health at school'.

Prof Banerjee, Professor of developmental Psychology, University of Essex, is the inaugural Pro Vice-Chancellor for Global and Civic Engagement at the University of Sussex. His research focuses on the social and emotional development of young people, and he works closely with practitioners and policy makers in the areas of education and mental health. He founded the Sussex Centre for Research on Kindness, an interdisciplinary research centre focused on illuminating the nature of kindness and its impacts on people and communities.

Dr Wilson Milton Were: 'Comprehensive agenda for the health and wellbeing of all children'

Dr Were, Lead Child Health Services, WHO, Geneva, Switzerland. Dr. Were is the global technical lead expert for child health service, policy, strategy and clinical practice guideline in the WHO. He is a Ugandan Paediatrician with more than 25 years' experience in global public health. He has led several global child health programs and currently leads the WHO's global work on redesigning child and adolescent health programming in the context of the sustainable development goals.

During the ISM, the Dolores Luiz Prize will be awarded to the best of three shortlisted presentations on research related to 'The Child of 2024: challenges faced by the child, the family, the community and professionals'. This prize is awarded in memory of Prof Dolores Luiz, Nelson Mandela University, SA who

encouraged and supported research using the Griffiths Scales.

We look forward to seeing many Griffiths III members support and celebrate this exciting anniversary event with us.

Griffiths III Training Courses

· Griffiths III Refresher Training:

Is it some years since you completed your Griffiths III training?

The Griffiths III scales were launched in May 2017, just over 7 years ago. If you feel you would benefit by updating your Griffiths III assessment skills, the Griffiths III Video Training Course is available as a refresher training course for existing registered Griffiths III users at a reduced fee of £100. The online module takes approximately 10 hours to complete and includes videos of children completing test items and 2 videos of full assessments. You will receive access to the VTC for 6 months and during this time you can access the training materials as often as you wish. Details are available on the ARICD website aricd.ac.uk

Griffiths III - A Case Study Book for Practitioners

Research Committee

Griffiths III has recently been submitted jointly by ARICD and Hogrefe to the BPS/EFPA Test Review for accreditation. The results usually take several months.

Griffiths Development Gauge

Work continues on the Griffiths Development Gauge, particularly in relation to a decision whether this might be standalone equipment rather than items scored from a full Griffiths kit.

Griffiths III Translations

Work on translations for different home languages continues. The translated verbal script for Griffiths III has proved very helpful for use when the examiner can read and understand English but the young child speaks only their home language.

Griffiths III US standardization

Discussion has started with the Hogrefe Boston office regarding the methodology for a US standardisation of Griffiths III, prior to the test's full release in the US.

ARICD plus Hogrefe is supporting Dr Ezhilmangai Ravichandran Poorani to attend the 2024 Annual meeting of the Society of Developmental and Behavioral Pediatricians in Washington DC where she is presenting a poster entitled "Exploring the use of Griffiths III in Autism Spectrum Disorder in India – A Snapshot". Dr Ashwin Navsaria is attending the ICP 2024 in Prague and will be presenting an oral paper entitled "Round and round, up and down.... using the Griffiths III Wheel to interpret and report test findings."
